2017/18: new 10-12 curriculum; new provincial exams, new "FSA"; new 10-12 reporting order Curriculum and assessment changes:

- New this year: communicating student learning pilot (elementary)
- Support for staff and parents



- Graduation program (Gr. 10-12) Drafts: this year
- Graduation Program implementation set for next year
- FSA continue this year with a limited pilot of new format
- Provincial exams: Gr. 10 and 11 exams eliminated; new literacy and numeracy assessment under development
